## **Research Experience**

- 2023- Primary Investigator: Along with one of my undergraduate students, we are Ongoing exploring the impact of incarceration on mental health. We are surveying people who spent a minimum of two years in prison, who have since released. We are exploring the ability to access mental health resources since returning to the community.
- 2023- Primary Investigator: *Tiffin City Schools School Climate Survey*. Along with a colleague and two of my undergraduate students, we have created a school climate survey that will be administered to Middle School and High School Students. Tiffin City Schools' Superintendent reached out to me and asked for help in better understanding the experiences of the students.
- 2023-2024 Primary Investigator: How helpful is Mutual Help? Along with a student, we are examining the role of Mutual Help Groups (i.e. AA, NA, etc.). We want to better understand how people perceive their experiences in these groups, and whether these groups really do help individuals struggling with addiction.
- 2022- Primary Investigator: *Horizon Program Evaluation*. This is a drug and alcohol Ongoing reentry program at Ohio Reformatory for Women. The research team is two professors and 5 undergraduate Psychology and Criminology students. We had successful completed HU's IRB and are awaiting approval from Ohio Department of corrections
- 2022- Primary Investigator: *High Impact Teaching Experiences: Prison Pen Pal* Ongoing *Program.* The research team is two professors and three Department of Correction Employees. We are exploring the impact of a prison pen pal program on university students and incarcerated women.
- 2022-2023 Primary Investigator: *Returning Citizens as Prison Volunteers: "To Build a Bridge Between Institutions and Communities."* The research team includes a colleague in Australia and two graduate students. We published a paper in 2023 and will continue work exploring prison volunteers.
