MUS 100-400, Ensembles: Music Education majors with an Instrumental Emphasis must participate in one MAJOR instrumental ensemble during each semester of enrollment, a minimum of eight ensemble experiences. They are also required to have two semesters of choral ensemble; it is recommended that this experience be completed in the first two years of study. MUS 100: first year of study; MUS 200: second year of study, etc.

MUS 150: Athletic Band: Wind, brass and percussion majors are required to participate in Athletic Band unless excused by the Department of Music.

Instrumental Methods courses: Students are required to complete 7 hours of courses in Instrumental Methods (MUS 273-74: Woodwinds; MUS 270: Percussion; MUS 379: Strings, MUS 371-72: Brass.) MUS 125: **The seventh and final hour of study is to be completed by taking applied lessons in an area outside the student's major family of instruments.**

Piano Proficiency: Students must complete a piano proficiency exam before student teaching (MUS 092, Piano Proficiency II). The proficiency may be taken as early as the third semester of study.

MUS 213: World Music: this required course is available on variable credit (2 or 3 hours). The third hour will require additional work by the student. For more information, please consult the instructor.

This includes a minimum of two hours each of instrumental and choral ensembles. Three hours of the 8 may be completed through Piano Chamber Music, subject to faculty availability. MUS 100: first year of study; MUS 200: second year of study, etc.

Instrumental Methods courses: Students are required to complete 7 hours of courses in Instrumental Methods (MUS 273-74: Woodwinds; MUS 270: Percussion; MUS 379: Strings, MUS 371-72: Brass.) MUS 125: The seventh and final hour of study is to be completed by taking applied lessons in an area outside the student's major family of instruments.

MUS 128: second semester of study
MUS 227: third semester of study
MUS 228: fourth semester of study etc.

MUS 051-058, Performance Class: Music majors must sign up for Performance Class during each semester of study in the program. MUS 051: first semester of study; MUS 052: second semester of study, MUS 053: third semester of study, etc.

MUS 100-400, Ensembles: Music Education majors with a Vocal Emphasis must participate in one MAJOR choral ensemble during each semester of enrollment, a minimum of eight ensemble experiences. They are also required to have two semesters of instrumental ensemble; it is recommended that this experience be completed in the first two years of study. MUS 100: first year of study; MUS 200: second year of study, etc.

Instrumental Methods courses: Students are required to complete 6 hours of courses in Instrumental Methods (MUS 273-74: Woodwinds; MUS 270: Percussion; MUS 379: Strings, MUS 371-72: Brass.) Students in the Music Ed voice degree are NOT required to complete a seventh hour of study, as is the case with the other Music Education programs. If a student chooses to do the seventh hour, it should be applied study in an instrumental area that would be of benefit to the student's education.

Piano Proficiency: Students must complete a piano proficiency exam before student teaching (MUS 092, Piano Proficiency II). The proficiency may be taken as early as the third semester of study.

MUS 213: World Music: this required course is available on variable credit (2 or 3 hours). The third hour will require additional work by the student. For more information, please consult the instructor.

Course sequence/Grade Requirements: Students are required to observe course sequences, especially in the areas of Music Theory/Aural Training and courses in Education, Music Education. Consult the Department of Music's Student Handbook, and the College Catalog for specific grade requirements. Students should also be aware of GPA requirements from the Department of Education. Please consult the Education Department section of the catalog for additional information.

Student Teaching Seminar: Student teaching field assignments take first priority in terms of time and commitment during the final student teaching semester.

- Ensembles: sign up for one Major Ensemble; come to rehearsals only as your student teaching assignment allows.
- Lessons: no applied lessons or Senior Recital is to be scheduled while the student is in the public schools completing a student teaching field assignment.
